



Nearly 100 spectators gathered around a field in New Brunswick, N.J. on November 6, 1869 to witness a game unlike anything seen before. On that day, Rutgers defeated Princeton, 6-4, but the players left a lasting legacy that would evolve into the great spectacle of college football.
